CDBG Grants Awarded

The State of Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs recently announced Community Development Block Grant awards for 7 communities in southeast Alabama. These grants will provide much needed improvements for the citizens of southeast Alabama. Town of Midland City Continues Housing Rehabilitation

The Town of Midland City continues helping low- and moderate-income homeowners make much needed repairs to their homes. Midland City received a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$350,000 to make repairs such as electrical issues, roof replacement, window replacement, handicap accessible needs, and HVAC systems from homeowners. So far eleven homes have been rehabbed totaling over \$232,000 in improvements for low to moderate income persons. This grant so far has improved the lives of many in Midland City.

Title V Senior Employment Program

The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) is a vital initiative aimed at providing job training and employment opportunities for low-income, unemployed seniors age 55 and older. Sponsored by the Department of Labor, SCSEP helps participants gain valuable work experience through community service activities at non-profit and public facilities, such as schools, libraries, and senior centers. Despite its importance, six out of the seven counties under our jurisdiction are currently under-enrolled. This under-enrollment poses significant challenges, as it limits the program's ability to reach and assist eligible seniors who could greatly benefit from its services. To correct this, the Department of Labor has granted extra funding to help seniors gain computer skills so they can be successful in their search for employment.

Our office was one of the pilot offices. The program has been so successful they are now on Cohort 5 and they just announced that the Department of Labor has agreed to fund it for another year.
